
Zaheer Ali has been actively involved within the Muslim community for many years. Born and educated in Britain, he is by profession an IT Project Manager.

How to get to Civic Centre in Hounslow:

By Underground: Take the Piccadily line to Hounslow Central, then turn right from Station, walk down Lampton Road and cross the Zebra Crossing you will find the sign to Civic Centre

By Bus: Take the 120 or H20 which will stop right outside Civic Centre

By Car: From Great West Road (A4) turn right into Lampton Road (A3005) on mini roundabout, pass the Zebra Crossing and turn on your first right.

From Staines and Bath Road, turn towards Lampton Road from Hounslow High Street, drive down pass the Hounslow Central Tube Station (on your right) before the Zebra Crossing turn left.

How to get to HAAYA Office:

By Underground – Take the Piccadily Line to Hounslow East, turn right of the station and walk down Kingsley Road

By Bus: Take the 111 which will stop right outside the HAAYA Office

By Car: From Great West Road (A4) turn into Spring Grove Road until you meet the mini roundabout, turn right and head towards Kingsley Road

From Staines or Bath Road head towards Lampton Road in Hounslow Central then turn right at the end of the road into Spring Road until you come to another mini round about and turn right again and then right on the third mini roundabout.
